It is this time of year I often think about our transition into our new clubhouse. I find it almost unfathomable that we will begin our fourth season in the new structure as it seems like just yesterday, we were gaining occupancy and making the move. In my opinion, it is just not coincidence that we have experienced our three most profitable financial cycles throughout our initial three years in the new building. Many reasons can be cited on various fronts for these increased business levels due to our new structure. Here are a few that quickly come to mind.

1. All one level has made the facility much more user friendly. The free-flowing nature of the building has been a huge factor with many of our larger events, especially SnoBlast and the Annual Craft Show. Also, with the Golf Shop in close proximity and steps away from the lounge, we witness added sales in both the pre and post round beverage/food and merchandise.

2. The banquet room and setting has been a popular space for all types of functions and events. Several factors have played into its popularity.

- The ability to separate the space and control the size and setting based on the function and number of participants

- A dedicated entrance, restrooms and cloakroom have been welcomed added features.

- The exclusive banquet bar with its prominent, easy to find location has helped immensely. No set up, no tear down with a full compliment of offerings has had much upside. It is also very suitable for two bartenders when deemed necessary.

- The panoramic views have been a great enhancement along with the very convenient access to the outdoor patio.
- The Bridal Suite has been a wonderful selling point and popular addition which has impacted the entire wedding experience nicely.

3. The office area with conference room has been much more efficient from a number of standpoints.

- The nearness of offices permits staff to be much more productive and allows for the team to operate as a more cohesive unit.
- Locating the Association Office has been so much easier with the very front and center, prominent position.

4. Having one well equipped kitchen rather than two inefficient kitchens has aided greatly in the recent successes with our food and beverage profitability.

- The well-appointed, centrally located kitchen plays well for our regular transient business and also for the largest of banquets of which we have had many.

5. Snack Shack/Pool area structure has been helpful in a number of respects:

- Easily accessible restrooms are now conveniently located directly off the pool deck.

- Food and Beverage numbers have been attractive and much of this can be attributed to the easy access without leaving the pool area.

- The new golfer restrooms positioned within this structure have been beneficial in expediting the turn activities from #9 to #10.

Those are some of the reasons I believe the new clubhouse idea, concept and well-planned construction have been a game changer from a business perspective. I am quite certain that most of us expected an initial bump in business just as most things have a tendency to do, but I have been more than pleasantly surprised that the initial surge continues and grew throughout the three seasons. Being a realist, I know at some point things will level, but we can all enjoy riding this wave as long as it lasts. I feel it is important to give perspective like this to let you know your investment has done well thus far. Thank you for being an amazingly supportive group in so many ways, I look forward to an active and prosperous 2024 season.

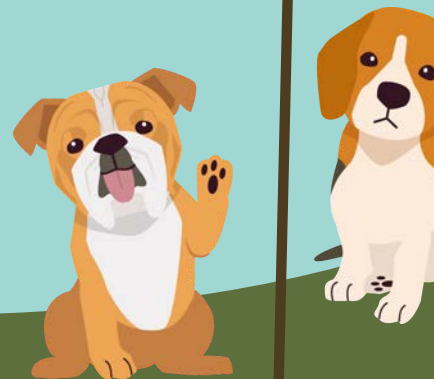

Minutes: December 21, 2023, minutes reviewed. Motion by Boening/Wright to approve minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: December 2023 unaudited financial reports were reviewed. Motion by Boening/Wright to approve unaudited financials as presented. Motion carried.

Manager's Report: Warm weather conditions will play a factor in some outdoor activities for SnoBlast, February 9-11. Decisions will be made later this

week/early next week about a few outdoor activities. A special menu will be featured for Valentine's Day. The menu will go out in the next newsletter scheduled to be mailed tomorrow. Golf shop staff are preparing for the Chicago, Minnesota, and Milwaukee golf shows. Visit Rome is providing funding to attend, and booth space will be shared with Sand Valley.

Committee Reports and Correspondence: Fish stick program efforts continue. The first phase of the program included dropping roughly twenty-four trees along the shoreline. The second phase is to take dropped trees and move them to DNR approved location through the lake, anchor them, and when the ice melts, they will sink to provide fish habitat. On January 26, a group moved thirty-seven trees in bundles to seven locations on the east end of Lake Arrowhead. The process will be repeated, ice allowing, in the coming months for the west end of Lake Arrowhead. Collaboration between Lake Arrowhead, Tri-Lakes, and the DNR will allow for fish planting in Fall 2024.

Old Business: Nothing to discuss.

New Business: 2024/25 Budget – information for both Lake Arrowhead and East Briar budgets for 2024/2025 fiscal year were given to board members to review after the last meeting. Each director has had time to review and ask questions pertaining to both budgets. With no further questions, a motion was made by Boening/Bulin to approve 2024/25 budget as presented. Motion carried.

Bob Benkowski apprised the board of additional information regarding the request received through the A&E committee for a driveway to connect to the South Lake Center driveway on the east side. If utilities were moved to the west, there would be sufficient room for garage and driveway on east side of home. Motion by Benkowski/Wright to deny request to have a private driveway connect to South Lake Center driveway. Motion carried.

Closed Session: Motion by Bulin/Boening at 8:17 a.m. to take a ten-minute break and enter closed session to discuss legal items. Motion carried.

Motion by Boening/Bulin to leave closed session and return to open session at 9:10 am. Motion carried.

Golf Course Superintendent's Message - Ken Lacy

Welcome to Spring!

Thank you, Lake Arrowhead Members for an outstanding 2023 season! My first year in the Norther Midwest was enjoyable. 2023 brought challenges with it. Record drought and heat in the region tested our crew and irrigation system. We were able to overcome those challenges and I learned a lot about the golf courses along the way. We worked to become a cohesive team, uniting the maintenance staffs of both courses. I have learned a great deal from the crew members who have shared their years of on-site experiences and local knowledge with me. Last season we increased the width of the collars on all greens which gave golfers a wider margin for error around the greens. After experimenting with the intermediate cut around fairways we have decided to reimplement it.

Heading into the 2024 season, I have confidence that we can build on the lessons learned in 2023 and deliver enhancements to course conditions. The Golf Course Maintenance Staff's target will be to produce "Firm & Fast" conditions on fairways and greens without sacrificing turf health. We will also work to improve the appearance of the rough to improve the playability and integrity of The Pines and The Lakes.

We are planning some modifications and areas of emphasis to our maintenance program. This Spring, we will implement a new aggressive, early season program on both courses. Our crew will make one granular application in early Spring

which includes fertility, pre-emergent herbicide, and insecticide to fairways, tees, and rough. This program will result in the suppression of crabgrass and white grubs as well as increasing fertility retention to ensure turf health throughout the Summer.

With the assistance of our volunteer divot crews, and staff, our par 3 tees remained in good condition throughout the season. However, as total rounds of golf increase, our focus on maintaining quality tee areas and keeping up with divots must be heightened. This Spring we enlarged hole #4 front tee and leveled the middle tee. We also plan to reshape and add new plants and landscaping surrounding the tee box to the right of #4 to increase curb appeal.

As the 2024 golf season gets underway, we will constantly evaluate our maintenance practices and work to communicate with members through the newsletter and golf shop staff. I read somewhere this Winter that "Great team-work makes the green work". Your participation and continued care are crucial to realizing our goal of constantly improving conditions at The Lakes and The Pines.

I am excited to continue to improve our team and the golf courses of Lake Arrowhead in 2024!

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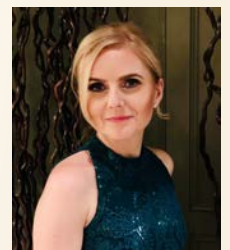
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Golf Shop News - Darryl Sorbo

With the Winter season being so unseasonably warm the optimism of opening early was on everyone's mind. There were a number of factors on why we did not.

- The cold of Winter is a great equalizer.
- Will we be able to stay open for long?
- Long range weather forecast.
- When nothing is growing its all the same, any damage will not repair itself.
- Cart damage contributes about 75% for all turf damage during the year.

We have updated the handicap cart policy to help maintain the turf conditions around the tee boxes and greens. Listed below are the details. They will be on handicap flags as well. We thank you in advance for adhering to the policy.

- Carts shall remain on the cart paths with all four wheels on the path.
- Parking carts on slopes/surrounds of any green or tee box is prohibited.
- Please stay at least 20 feet away from the green.
- Please do not drive between bunkers and greens.
- You may use Par 3 fairways.
- The best place to drive close to a green is straight up the approach.
- To exit, drive the car around the bunkers to the nearest cart path.

How can you help?

Cart traffic contributes about 75% for turf damage all year. In a fight between tires and turf, the tire usually wins. The Golf Shop and superintendent are counting on you to partner in protecting these areas. Remember – leave the course better than you found it.

New for 2024, we are expanding the forward tee box on Hole #4 of the Pines (left side) to allow for more teeing options and for better turf conditions throughout the season. The middle tee box will be leveled out and raised for more options in setting up the teeing ground as well.

If you are interested in new golf clubs for the upcoming season and would like to be fitted, Callaway, Titleist, TourEDGE and Taylormade will have their technical representatives here at the Pines Driving Range on the following dates:

Callaway – Friday, May 17th 10 am to 2 pm

Titleist – Saturday, May 18th 10 am to 2 pm

TourEDGE – Tuesday, May 21st 10 am to 4 pm

TaylorMade – Saturday, June 8th 10 am to 2 pm

Fittings will be done by appointment only! Please contact the Golf Shop to schedule yours today.

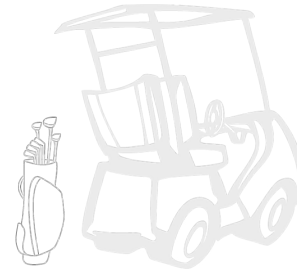

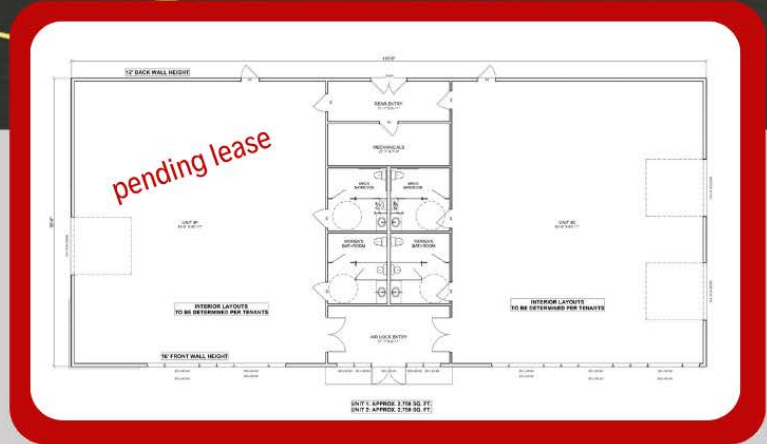

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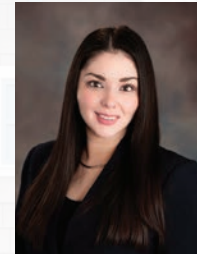
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Nekoosa Lions Kindness Award

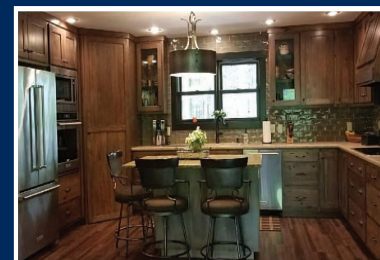
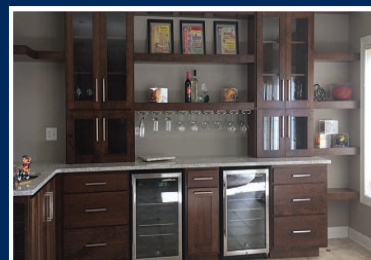

Follow Fertilizer Application Best Practices for Lake Health

Everybody looks forward to the spring and summer months as it means enjoyable times spent on our lakes. Good water quality is something we all appreciate and want to achieve on a continuing basis. When conditions are right, algae blooms can occur and sometimes even result in toxic Blue-Green Algae.

Algae blooms are caused by high levels of nitrogen and phosphorus. There is not a single cause that creates increased levels of nitrogen and phosphorus in our lakes. We, as property owners, can do our part to help stop nitrogen and phosphorus from our properties entering the ground water or running directly into the lakes.

A HUGE contributor to this runoff is lawn fertilizer. Recognizing the importance of healthy lakes to our community, the Town of Rome encourages lake frontage property owners to consider use of lake water irrigation as a source of natural fertilization in lieu of applying commercial lawn fertilizer products.

Further, the Town has enacted a fertilizer ordinance that includes the following:

- No fertilizer can be applied within 35 feet of the shoreline or to an established natural buffer zone
- Zero % phosphorus (the middle number on the package) is required by Wisconsin State Law
- Any fertilizer applied to impervious surfaces such as driveways and sidewalks needs to be immediately contained and either legally applied to turf or placed in an appropriate container
- No person shall apply any lawn fertilizer within the Town of Rome that is labeled as containing less than 20% slow-release nitrogen.

Many of us come to our lake community from the city. Often there, pride in maintaining a pristine, weed-free green lawn is the norm. However, in lake communities, the opposite is required in order to affect the good water quality that we all desire. **The best practice for shoreline properties is to stop fertilizing or to switch only to lake water irrigation. For those properties that are offshore, we recommend that you consider stopping fertilizing or using a fertilizer product with a high content of slow-release nitrogen.**

Please join us in implementing these efforts to improve our lakes.

14 Mile Watershed Alliance Immersed in Strategic Planning

While this young organization has already had an impact in its work to educate the stakeholders of the watershed about how to protect our water resources, the organization has begun a comprehensive strategic planning process to have a broader impact on our water quality future. This process began in December, 2023 and will finish in March, 2024 after an evaluation of the watershed needs for the long term. The continuing mission of the 14 Mile Watershed Alliance is to protect and improve the condition of the watershed water sources for all stakeholders. Early steps in the planning process have identified the need to have a greater impact on the excess water nutrients (primarily nitrogen and phosphorous) from non-point sources that make their way into both the surface and groundwater from throughout the entire watershed, then into our lakes and streams.

Planning continues but our preliminary direction recognizes that:

- 1) Any actions will be data driven.
- 2) The organization will be adding more experts in highlighted fields to its volunteer team from the community that have work life experience that can be used to accomplish our objectives.
- 3) Communication and education will be key components of the resulting plan.
- 4) The 14 Mile Watershed Alliance will remain a community based nonprofit organization.

Lake Arrowhead Things to Know

This is a summary of restrictions only. A full copy of the **DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS, COVENANTS AND EASEMENTS** can be found at “lakearrowheadgolf.com/about/links” scroll down to download.

The restrictions, covenants and easements are imposed to promote the quality of life of the community by establishing standards for development.

V. RESTRICTIONS

1. No outside toilet or privy may be erected in the Community, except by the Developer.
2. No person may introduce any diseased or noxious plant, animal or insect.
3. No activity which interferes with the privacy of any other person.
4. No noxious, offensive, or illegal activities shall be tolerated on any tract.
5. No business can be run on any residential parcel.
6. No mobile home may be placed on any tract other than on mobile home lots.
7. No camping, except on lots designated for that purpose.
8. The only furniture allowed outside of buildings is lawn furniture.
9. Removal of trees and vegetation are restricted. Clear cutting must be approved with building plans.
10. Building techniques must guard against erosion.
11. Once construction begins, it must be completed in three months on mobile homes and nine months on residential lots.
12. No occupation until water and sewer are completed.
13. No stripped, partially wrecked, or junked motor vehicle, trailer, boat, refrigerator, stove/other appliances, or any other salvage item of any kind shall be permitted.
14. Fuel storage tanks must be buried or screened by fencing or shrubbery.
15. Clotheslines shall be placed so they are out of view. NOT allowed in EASTBRIAR.
16. All tracts shall be well-maintained.
18. Any damaged structure must be rebuilt or repaired as quickly as possible.
19. Only one mobile home allowed on a mobile home lot and must be 500 sq. ft.: a minimum length of twenty-two (22) feet and one (1) accessory building.
20. All structures must conform to local building codes.
21. Setbacks for buildings are 35 feet from FRONT LOT LINE (100 feet for Spotted Fawn), 10 feet from SIDE LOT LINES & 25 feet from REAR LOT LINES.
22. No parcel or lot shall be divided or re-divided, except as is otherwise specifically provided in the declaration.
23. Nothing may be done on any residential lot, which alters the surface drainage patterns in such a way as to be detrimental to any other tract in the Community.
24. SEE RESTRICTIONS FOR COMMERCIAL LOTS.
25. The committee MAY ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS governing the burning of trash, rubbish, grass, brush and other materials anywhere in the Community.
26. Only ONE single family in a dwelling lot.
27. Dwelling must have a minimum of 760 sq. ft. Fairway, Waterfront or Restricted lots must be 1000 sq. ft., 1400 sq. ft. in EASTBRIAR.
- 29(a). All associated structures shall be built of NEW MATERIALS. Place of USED structures shall be prohibited.
- 29(b). No animals other than normal pets such as cats & dogs- two each is the MAXIMUM.
- 29(c). NO SIGNS. (Including, but not limited to, “For Sale”, “For Rent”, or similar signs) billboards or other advertising structure of any kind may be erected or maintained anywhere in the Community.
- 29(e). No trees over six (6) inches in diameter shall be removed, except as necessary for construction.
- 29(j). “Subdued Natural Tones” which is compatible with the usual esthetics of the surrounding natural environment. “The Committee shall be the final judge of what constitutes “subdued Natural Tones”.
1. Any construction work on any residential lot, with the cost of at least \$100.00 REQUIRES approval of the committee.
- 29(i). Complete plans for any proposed associated structure or other construction work is required.

In the event that you have received approval from the Town of Rome for your building project, YOU MUST COME TO LAKE ARROWHEAD A&E COMMITTEE FOR APPROVAL OF OUR COVENANT AND RESTRICTIONS "BEFORE" ANY CONSTRUCTION BEGINS!
